This year's ride is an opportunity for NASTR, and all who have enjoyed our trails and rides over the years, to say thank you and give back. Please join us at the Red Rock Rumble to say thank you to Kenny and Connie.

WELCOME RIDERS to the fourth annual Red Rock Rumble 50 and 30 mile endurance ride. This area will be familiar to many folks who have enjoyed Red Rock rides in the past; however, we are using different areas as well. So while it will be familiar it will also be new. Through the generosity of several local ranchers, we will have lots of water available throughout the ride. It is the consideration of another local land owner that we were able to get you into some really great areas. This is a wonderful time of year to see the deer, antelope, and wild horse herds. There can be some grass along the trail depending on rainfall.

CAMP: The camp is bare bones. There is horse water available, but for the most part you need to plan on bringing what you need. There will be no camp fires allowed. Parking is very limited so if you can trailer-pool then please do so and plan on parking conservatively. There is absolutely no parking or camping of ride entrants allowed on the burned (left side as you enter camp) side of the road.

DIRECTIONS: Ride camp is located off Red Rock Road, just a little north of Reno. Take the Red Rock Exit off US Hwy 395 and head east 15 miles. There will be ribbons and signs telling you where to turn right onto a dirt road. Follow the dirt road about a mile to camp. This is a single lane road and will be entrance only on Friday/Saturday am and exit only on Saturday pm/Sunday.

THE RIDES: There will be a 50 mile and 30 mile ride. All vet checks will be at ride camp. The 50 mile ride will consist of a three loops (20,15, and 15 miles). The 30 mile ride will consist of two loops, with a hold at the 15 mile point. The trail is almost entirely sandy jeep roads and sandy single track. There are hardly any rocks. You will pass through a meadow or two that can be wet depending on the weather, and there is usually a bit of trail grass along the way as well. There are no significant water crossings but if we have a wet fall there can be very small creeks. Light snacks and beverages will be available, as well as water and hay for horses.

INTRODUCTORY RIDE: We are offering an Introductory Ride this year as well, for those who want to experience endurance riding at a beginner's level. Scenic trail sections will be marked out for 5 and 10 mile distances. Introductory riders can ride any combination of sections.

MEALS: TBD. If applicable, meals will be pay as you go at the ride. Please check our Facebook page regularly for updates.

SANCTIONING / RULES: The 50/30 mile rides are sanctioned by AERC. All NASTR/AERC rules apply.

CONTROL JUDGES: Head Control Judge is Susan McCartney, D.V.M.

PRE-VET CHECK will be held Friday 4-7pm. All horses must be vetted and numbered before starting the ride.

PRE-RIDE MEETING will be Friday at 7 pm. A new rider meeting will be held at 6 pm.

START TIMES: 50's start at 7:00 a.m. ~ 30's start at 8:00 a.m. ~ Introductory Riders start at 8:30 a.m.

AWARDS: Completion awards will be given to all finishers of both rides. First Place, Best Condition, 1st in each weight division, first Junior, and top ten will be awarded for the 50. Best Condition will be awarded for the Limited Distance Ride. Awards will be announced at 6 pm Saturday. Riders are responsible to pick up their awards. They will not be shipped.

● ● LIVESTOCK TRANSPORTATION REQUIREMENTS ● ●

1. All regulations apply to both horses and cattle whether branded or not.
2. To enter Nevada, you must comply with your state of origin's requirements for brand inspection. All documents must adequately identify those animals in your possession. If not you may be subject to fines or seizure.
3. In Nevada, a current valid brand inspection certificate is required and must be in your possession. If your state of origin does not require brand inspection on horses, then you should have some proof of ownership accompanying them. Nevada residents should have proof of ownership in possession at all times when transporting livestock.
4. Lifetime Horse Permits are available to Nevada residents. These permits are issued in lieu of brand inspection certificates and are honored statewide and in California, Oregon, Idaho, Arizona and Utah. Annual Permits are also available for movement within the state but are not to be used for change of ownership.
5. A current Livestock Health Certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian is required to enter the State of Nevada. It must show your animals to be in good health and free from disease. A Coggins Test performed within the previous six months is required on horses. Cattle for sale, show or remaining in Nevada, require an Entry Permit. For further information on health requirements, contact Animal Industry at (775) 738-8076.
6. When open you are required to stop at all Nevada Highway Patrol Commercial Vehicle Inspection Stations.

NASTR RIDE RULES (also see AERC rules and regulations)

1. The rides are open to all persons and any breed or type of equine. Senior riders are persons over 16 years of age by December 1st of the competition year.
2. A Junior is a rider under the age of 16 as of December 1st of the year of competition. All Junior riders must be accompanied by a Senior rider sponsor at all times, who is 21 years of age or older, and must finish within 1 minute of that sponsor. The sponsor must agree to remain with the Junior throughout the ride. If the sponsor is eliminated during the ride, the Junior may continue with another willing sponsor upon notification to ride officials. Notification shall be made before the Junior continues to ride. All Junior riders are required to wear helmets.
3. There shall be no unauthorized horses on the trail.
4. Horses must be at least 60 months of age for the 50 mile ride, 48 months for the 30 mile ride, as confirmed by the Ride Vet.
5. Each horse and rider must cross the finish line within 12 hours elapsed time on the 50 mile ride, and 7:15 hours elapsed time on the 30 mile LD ride, to qualify for any awards.
6. The same horse and rider must pass all control points and stay on the marked trail to qualify for any awards.
7. There will be **NO TIES ALLOWED**.
8. Abusive behavior or harassment of ride personnel, veterinarians, riders, crews, or volunteers will not be tolerated, and may be grounds for disqualification or cause of future entry refusal.
9. Abuse of the horse and use of stimulants and/or pain killers are prohibited. All horses shall be subject to blood and/or urine tests.
10. Riders/horse owners are financially responsible for any emergency treatment provided.
11. Ride Veterinarians' opinions will be final on all matters concerning the horse.
12. Ride officials' decisions will be final.
13. Violation of any of these ride rules shall be grounds for disqualification of horse and rider from this ride.
